



MISSION OUTDOOR PARK SYSTEM CONCEPTUAL PLANNING PROCESS UPDATE

August 2022

Based on community surveys and City Council goals, the **top priority** for revenues generated by a renewed sales tax would be for significant investment in Mission's outdoor parks.

The conceptual planning process – both at the individual park level and for the overall outdoor system - is an important part of building the road map for the future of enhanced recreational amenities in our community. It allows the City to:

- Develop order of magnitude costs for future park improvements
- Identify potential maintenance, replacement or repair costs based on desired amenities
- Evaluate the potential for phased improvements
- Pursue grant funding or partnership opportunities

The improvements presented here reflect the current discussions based on public input received over the last 12-18 months, and most recently in an open house forum in May. Until there is a decision/vote on renewal of the sales tax, the City is unable to finalize all the specific details, implementation timelines, etc.

We have listened to the community to develop the vision for our parks, and now must identify the appropriate resources to turn that vision into a reality.

Mission voters will have the chance to consider the sales tax renewal question in a mail ballot election planned for September 2022.

MOHAWK PARK IMPROVEMENTS

Phase I (Construction to begin September August 2022)

- 3 gender inclusive, multi-user style restroom facilities (including water fountains)
- 75-person capacity shelter with 2 grills
- Gathering plaza with seating terrace
- Improved pathway connections to parking lot and existing trails
- ADA access improvements to the existing trails
- Landscape enhancements (more native plantings and trees)
- Upgraded 48-stall parking lot with designated ADA stalls

Future Phase(s) include:

- ½ court basketball and pickleball facilities
- Shaded, inclusive playground area
- Perimeter loop trail enhancements



WATERWORKS PARK IMPROVEMENTS

(Planned to coincide with Rushton rebuild)

- 2 gender inclusive, multi-user style restroom facilities (including water fountains)
- 50-person capacity shelter with grill
- ADA access improvements to the existing trails
- Landscape enhancements (more native plantings and trees)
- Upgraded parking facilities (13 stalls, with designated ADA stalls)
- Shaded, inclusive playground area
- Perimeter loop trail enhancements
- Rain garden



STREAMWAY PARK IMPROVEMENTS

(First phase in 2023)

- 2 gender inclusive, multi-user style restroom facilities (including water fountains)
- 50-person capacity shelter with grill
- ADA access improvements to the existing trails
- Upgraded parking facilities (57 stalls, with designated ADA stalls)
- Perimeter loop trail enhancements, including pedestrian lighting
- Preferred (from public open house feedback) location for dog park



BROADMOOR PARK IMPROVEMENTS

(Construction schedule TBD)

- 2 gender inclusive, multi-user style restroom facilities (including water fountains)
- 75-person capacity shelter with grill
- ADA access improvements to the existing trails
- Landscape enhancements (more native plantings and trees) ½ court basketball and pickleball facilities
- Shaded, inclusive playground area
- Reconstruction of perimeter loop trail enhancements
- Potential alternative location for dog park
