## MISSION ARTS CENTER brings art from Ukraine and the rest of the world to the Kansas City area

rom peaceful Mission to volatile Ukraine, creativity and the arts endure informing us about ourselves and the world. Lyudmyla Savinkova, owner/director of Mission Arts Center, is originally from Ukraine and now wants to share her love of both local and international art with the people of Mission. She describes the Mission Arts Center as "standing as a beacon of creativity and healing in Mission, Kansas."

The Mission Arts Center was established in 2022. It serves as a gallery showcasing unique works from both local and international artists, with a particular emphasis on pieces from Ukraine. Many art lovers know engaging in the creative process has immense therapeutic benefits, particularly for mental health. This is reflected in the center's commitment to non-clinical art therapy, catering to a diverse community, including Ukrainian refugees who have faced significant trauma.

"The Mission Arts Center has rapidly become an integral part of the local community, not just as a space for artistic expression but as a haven for mental wellbeing," Savinkova said.

Through the Center's art and art wellness classes, visitors are offered an accessible outlet for creativity and healing, welcoming individuals of all ages and skill levels. Its role extends beyond just an educational facility; by hosting events, exhibitions, and programs, the Center fosters a sense of community and cultural enrichment.

"As the owner, curator, and art instructor at the Mission Arts Center, my involvement is deeply personal and professional," said Savinkova, who believe her Arts Center adds a unique voice to the community. "Originating from Ukraine, my experiences have profoundly shaped the center's vision and offerings. My role encompasses a diverse range of responsibilities, from curating artworks and organizing exhibitions to designing and leading art wellness classes. The center manifests my commitment to art as a healing force. I also volunteer my time and resources to give back to the community, especially supporting those who have endured hardships akin to those faced by many in Ukraine."

Savinkova has a passion in her voice when she speaks about these issues. She believes strong voices are crucial to understanding events like the war in Ukraine. The Center wants to help cultivate more strong voices.

"I am committed to guiding the Mission Arts Center as a vital community resource where creativity and compassion are interwoven," Savinkova continued. "Every individual's story is honored and heard. I strive to provide an accessible platform for residents of Mission to explore their artistic talents in a supportive and welcoming environment."

Being an Arts Center means there are always some new, exciting events coming up.

One of the most exciting upcoming events is the "Masks: Narratives Beneath the Surface" exhibition, curated by Savinkova and Sydney Pener. This mixedmedia mask exhibition, running from December 8, 2023, to February 17, 2024, is more than just an artistic showcase; it's a philanthropic endeavor, with a portion of the proceeds benefiting Sunflower House and Tyler's House KC. This exhibition in support of local organizations underscores the Center's commitment to social impact.

"Following this exhibition, our dedication to healing through art continues with a project to support Ukrainian refugees and other waraffected communities," Savinkova said. From February 22 through April 26, 2024, the Center will create and display a community mural. "This collective artwork will stand as a symbol of resilience and hope. The free accompanying art therapy workshops will provide a therapeutic outlet for participants to process and articulate their experiences through the power of creative expression." Mission Arts Center is also proud to become an official Community Partner to the Girl Scouts of Greater Kansas City as of 2024 to empower young minds through art.

The Mission Arts Center has several outlets for those looking to share

their voice. Visitors are encouraged to uncover their creative

potential, join a class, and experience the power of art. The motto is "Your creative spark awaits at the Mission Arts Center – where curiosity and growth thrive."

#### Sculptor Marcella Lally chisels out her story

Mission supports its homegrown artists. Marcella (or as her friends like to call her Marcy) Lally is just such a Mission resident. She has worked her entire life to achieve her status as a working artist, and she got here by thinking outside the box.

Lally is a sculptor by trade; her current body of work focuses on nature and the passage of time with themes of death and rebirth. She hand sculpts birds, bugs, flowers and many other kinds of flora and fauna out of clay. Though her inspirations sometimes surprise people, it was a natural journey for her, as she explains in her own words.

"I am mostly known for assemblages that I have created incorporating hand sculpted ceramic flowers and other bits of vintage, ephemera arranged on real animal skulls," Lally said. "I call them portraits on nature, each one adorned carefully, creating its own unique narrative."

"I've worked on and off in the floral and horticultural industry for years. It was hard work but also very rewarding. There is something about the lore and language of flowers that has left a deep impression on me and the artwork I produce today," she continued.

While working in the floral industry Lally also taught creative workshops. She taught mixed media, assemblage and mosaic workshops at a little shop called Gardenology. She credits these years teaching workshops as giving her the confidence she needed to go forward and create her own stamp with her original pieces. Gardens and flowers have always fueled her inspiration.

Lally participates in open studios every fall and spring at the Livestock Exchange Building. This building houses over 30 different artists' studios who open their doors to the public. She also supplies artwork to galleries in New Orleans, Tennessee and Florida. These galleries keep Lally and her husband busy traveling across the country.



"We look at it as a road to discovery, friendships and adventures," Lally said. "It's been a lot of fun. I also hope to return to Sicily soon to study the native plant life, herbal remedies, ancient folklore and eat some pastries."

Artists are said to march to the beat of their own drum. Lally has done this as well, though she recognizes her path came from her roots. "I grew up in a family of creative people and craftsmen," Lally said. "My mother is a painter; my grandfather made ballet shoes for a living. My great-greatgrandfather was a stained-glass worker and a painter. The houses I lived in had my family's artworks hanging on the walls. It was a natural progression for me to follow in those footsteps, working with my hands and becoming an artist."

Growing up in this milieu gave Lally the confidence to try new things. She believes this approach has paid off with the positive local responses she has received. While Mission supports local artists, Lally believes artists return this favor in kind.

"Artists have an enormous impact on our community. More than we will ever really know," Lally said. "They set the tone and the vibe. Artists are responsible for giving a place, a setting, a venue its own character. Art breathes life and vibrancy into our city. Without this there would be no originality. I also think art helps people find their way in becoming who they are meant to be. It's a way to express yourself. We are blessed with

a lot of artists in this town and I think that's why it has so much pride and personality."


As for her specific works, the support there has been rewarding as well.

"I think in general I have gotten a positive response from my art. It's always validating when your artwork sells off a gallery wall," Lally said. "The art sort of takes on a life of its own once it leaves your hands, reaching destinations unknown. Especially when someone you don't know buys your art. I've been blessed to focus on a body of art that I believe has set me apart and has a lasting impression. I have my own aesthetic that is personal to me and the journey I have been on. It's really complementary and special when someone can relate to your vision and wants to be a part of that by being a fan or a patron."

Though her work may be exploring some big themes, it comes from some traditional training and medium. This education provided a strong base for Lally as she moves her work into the future.

"I am classically trained in sculpture," Lally said. "The one thing I took away from my studies is to keep an open mind. The world is your resource. I have never felt limited to one medium. Clay however has always been a natural choice for me, given the subject matter of what I make – flora and fauna. I believe clay symbolically references the diverse tones of earth itself. My artwork is conceptual and that dictates the medium. It's clay and bone today, tomorrow it may be stone and glass."

# ART IN SCHOOL Past and present students come together to support the Shawnee Mission North Patrons Gallery

The students of Shawnee Mission North High School have a unique resource for burgeoning artists right on campus that gives them a head start on their creative paths. The Greg Brantman Patrons Gallery has long been a venerated part of the school. Now Cathy Thomas, president and secretary of the gallery, and others are leading the charge for the gallery to stay at the forefront of local artistic expression, as well as highlight an important part of the gallery's foundation.

#### Honoring a teacher

The gallery's namesake is a teacher who left a lasting impact.

"Greg Brantman was my teacher at Shawnee Mission North from 1976 to 1979," Thomas said. "He was really an inspirational, creative teacher."

The gallery is run by the art teachers and a board of directors comprised of community volunteers and former teachers. Thomas quickly knew she wanted to be a part of it.

"When my oldest son started high school at Shawnee Mission North in 2002, I joined the gallery board to help in whatever way I could," she said." I've been the treasurer and secretary, fundraiser, and this year I took on the job as president."

Shawnee Mission North is currently working to raise money for the Greg Brantman Art Scholarship, which will be awarded each year to a graduating art senior. Last year, the school was fortunate to receive an individual grant of \$10,000; this donation was used to start an art scholarship fund. North has a number of scholarships in honor of athletic coaches, and the feeling was Greg Brantman was also more than worthy of this honor.

"He has had a tremendous impact over the years for thousands of students in the fine arts," Thomas said. "We need to raise an additional \$10,000 in order to be part of the Shawnee Mission North Scholarship Foundation. We're asking that the community help us reach that mark and support the scholarship with donations."

#### A gallery with deep roots

The Brantman Patrons Gallery became part of the school in 1979 and was the first high school art gallery in the nation at the time. Funding for the gallery came from the larger community under the efforts of Meg Cross who solicited support from major corporations and individuals throughout the Kansas City and Shawnee Mission areas. Greg Brantman, who was the ceramics, jewelry and sculpture teacher at the time, was also instrumental in starting the gallery. He taught at North until 2012 and is still active on the board of directors for the gallery.

The school completely renovated the gallery in 2022 after a successful

fundraising campaign brought in \$20,000 from the community. The front wall was replaced with glass, allowing students to see inside the gallery when they pass by.

"The gallery has the most impact on the students at Shawnee Mission North, but it reaches into the community-at-large as well," Thomas said. "AP Art students present their advanced work in senior shows each March and April. Alumni shows bring back former students who have gone on to careers in the arts or who still create on their own. "

In the Brantman Patrons Gallery, North students receive the opportunity for their work to share wall space with more established artists.

"We exhibit professional artists each year in the fall and early winter months," Thomas said. "Those professional artists present workshops or artist talks with the students to teach a specific skill or talk about how their careers evolved. We also have had photojournalism exhibits and North faculty shows where any teacher can submit something they made. It's a really interesting mix of talents and skills that we showcase."

The Brantman Patrons Gallery is located on the first floor of Shawnee Mission North High School, 7401 Johnson Drive, Overland Park, Kansas. For more information and to support Shawnee Mission North's efforts visit their website at patronsgallery.org.

#### **Progress Continues on Streets & Parks**

Thanks to the support of Mission residents in renewing dedicated sales taxes in 2021 and 2022, the City continues to make significant progress with investments in streets and parks. The City Council and staff remain committed to combining these important resources with other local revenues and grants to upgrade and enhance infrastructure and amenities throughout our community and 2023 was no exception. Notable projects for the past year include:

Foxridge Phase II Improvements (Lamar to 51st Street), over \$2 million in residential street improvements, and design of 55th Street improvements (Lamar to east City limits).

On the parks side, Phase I of the Mohawk Park improvements was completed which include restrooms and a pavilion. Phase II improvements, which add an inclusive playground and upgrade the walking trail, will begin construction in 2024.

The improvements at Waterworks Park were bid in the fall of 2023 and the contractor will begin work in January. The improvements are expected to be completed by August 2024 when the students return to the newly rebuilt Rushton Elementary School.

The walking trail at Broadmoor Park was also replaced in the fall with a 10-foot wide, ADA accessible concrete trail greatly enhancing this park on the westside of Mission.

We are looking forward to more progress in 2024, and thank our community for their ongoing support!











PAVING THE WAY



#### Sidewalk Snow Removal - What You Need to Know

Walkability and access for pedestrians year-round is an important value in Mission. There are many in our community who rely on being able to travel the City's sidewalks, and it's important that we all do our part to help keep everyone safe in snow conditions. Each winter season, the City receives a number of complaints from residents and visitors to local businesses regarding uncleared sidewalks which detract from the walkability of our community.

The City's code requires property owners to clear sidewalks within 48 hours of a snow event. This promotes timely snow removal to ensure the safety and convenience of those needing or wanting to get to work, school or errands during the winter months.

The ordinance includes provisions for a courtesy notice to be sent to owners, occupants or agents in charge of the sidewalks if they are not cleared, and there is no fee or assessment with the courtesy notice. One courtesy notice will be allowed each winter season. The ordinance gives the City the ability to remove



(abate) the snow if a property owner doesn't comply within the notice period and for the costs to be assessed back. For questions on Mission's snow removal ordinance, contact the Neighborhood Services Department at 913.676.8390.











#### Winter Snow Season Is Officially Here

The work of Mission's Public Works crews changes with each season. When inclement weather strikes, the Department turns its attention from street patching and repair to snow plowing operations. Mission operates two 12 hours shifts with 4-5 crew members each to ensure Mission's roadways are safe for travel.

- Plows run two routes focused on main thoroughfare streets and two focused on residential streets.
- Streets are prioritized by terrain, visibility, and amount of traffic. A street with hills and corners takes priority over a street that is flat and straight.
- Crews also remove snow from parking areas along Johnson Drive in the Downtown District, along sidewalks near schools, and along trails once streets have been cleared.
- All vehicles parked on streets must be removed when snow has accumulated to a depth of four inches or more, or any other time a Snow Emergency is declared, and kept off until snow has been removed.

Following the November 2023 municipal elections, Mission bid farewell to two members of the City Council who did not seek re-election.


Councilmembers Kristin Inman (Ward III) and Ken Davis (Ward IV) both elected not to pursue additional terms on Mission's City Council. Councilmember Inman was first elected in 2016 and has consistently advocated for infrastructure investments, strong fiscal management and quality



development. Councilmember Davis, also a former Councilmember and Mayor of Countryside, was originally appointed in 2018 and subsequently elected to the position. He has been a strong proponent of responsive government, infrastructure investment and public health initiatives, especially steps to reduce the availability and use of tobacco products. The City of Mission is fortunate to have such dedicated public representatives and we thank them for their dedicated service to all in our community.

#### KC Maker Studio and Fabrics promotes a disappearing art form

Art - the kind, who creates it and where it is created are all reflective of the history of a place. Sewn in the fabric of its identity, many current communities are taking old traditions and joining them with new practices, ideas and technology. This is Patti Meier's goal with KC Maker Studio and Fabrics. KC Maker Studio and Fabrics sells designer quality modern quilt fabrics, garment fabrics, needle arts and notions. They also sell modern equipment like Handiquilter Longarm quilting machines.

The threads of the community can be joined together at a place like KC Maker Studio and Fabrics. Similar to the oldfashioned sewing circles in small towns of yesteryear where women (and any interested men) would meet and catch up on the local news of the day, Meier wants her establishment to serve as an active hub for Mission. She has even set aside a particular day for this. "The goal is to ensure there is education for the next generation so that this art doesn't die off," Meier said.

"We bring the community together to sew and quilt each week via our sew days," Meier said. "Sewing is known to have excellent health benefits as it is a stress reducer. Our sewists love to come in, visit with others and work on their projects."


Meier says you don't have to be Betsy Ross to come and see what they are about. Sewers of any experience and knowledge level are invited. Men and women, young and old, programs at KC Maker Studio can be tailor made to fit whatever skill set might be needed. Whether you have been crocheting all your life or have never threaded a needle, if you have ever had any interest in sewing, you can drop on in.

"Everyone is welcome in our shop," Meier said. "We provide an open, accepting environment that allows everyone to flourish while perfecting their craft. Our staff is made up of experienced sewists and quilters, so we're always happy to answer customer questions or provide demos for them."

Set aside any preconceived notions of a small sewing shop, KC Maker Studio is a growing business. The shop opened in Mission in July of 2021 and Meier says it has quickly become the destination quilt shop in the Kansas City area. They expanded in September 2023 into an over 12,000 square foot space, making them the largest shop with the largest selection.

They now have over 12,000 bolts of





fabric; a number which is growing every day. Their dedication is not only to selling fabric, but also to providing education around sewing, quilting and needle arts. They have four classrooms to serve the customers and allow the KC Maker Studio staff to teach in small groups where they can provide individual instruction. They have classes almost every day of the week and host sew days 11 days each month. The sew days are where customers can bring their projects and sew together in the shop. KC Maker Studio is open seven days a week, allowing customers to shop despite busy schedules.

KC Maker Studio offers a wide range of beginner classes with new sessions starting every six weeks. These classes are specific to learning to quilt, learning to sew, garment sewing and kids sewing.

"The goal is to ensure there is education for the next generation so that this art doesn't die off," Meier said.


#### Tricia Allen: T. Allen Arts




